Dear Family and Friends,

At the end of my last letter, we were "homeward bound," enroute to Yokosuka. During that last week at sea, we held our annual Damage Control Olympics. The Philippine Sea was a long way from the Olympics of Los Angeles, but believe me, the competition proved almost as fierce. Coordinated by LTJG. HAROLD LALONDE, REEVES' Damage Control Assistant, the events covered basic knowledge and practical use of such things as gas masks, life jackets, first aid, and other life saving items.
